Our Aunt E, on our recent trip to Ireland recommended we stay at this particular lodging inn called Leixlip House.

We said our goodbyes and then headed our way to a few miles west of Dublin and this nice inn is located in the town of Leixlip. It is a very nice and old type of Georgian establishment and there were visitors from all over the country and mostly are business travelers. The rooms were only around 19, if I am not mistaken and they were individually decorated, as told by the inn staff. I was so happy that my aunt E had recommended us to this lodging place and she said that she had been to it before and was particularly pleased to know that the rooms were all furnished with antiques. She was right and I found that to be true and loving it so much. It gave an old, rustic feel which was very lovely indeed.

My family requested for a Superior double room, and so did my aunt's family. We just cramped in and there were ample space for all that we found. the room had a large, four-poster bed and a nice canopy with a padded headboard. The posters gave the room a homely feel and there was a chaise lounge near the foot of the bed. As for luggage storage, I was disappointed to find that there were none, and that included no luggage racks. However, everything from the prints on the walls right up to the chandelier was perfect and really artfully tasted to me.

Breakfast in this lodging house or inn were included with the price package of the rooms. We were given a nice and simple buffet but I didn't complain since there were fruit scones that I love so much. Other than that, fresh juices were available to and I was very happy to be getting some varieties of cereal as well.

The services given at Leixlip House was also in a full swing of a good customer service. The staff consisted of some senior people and also teenagers and they were providing an excellent service all the way through. Amenities that I managed to find in this lodging house/inn would be no activities at all. The only facilities were wireless but that was hard too, since one has to book a card access to surf the wireless, but those were already on loan. Dial-up there was pretty expensive and we stayed clear off it.

For a rustic and artfully tasteful feel, I recommend Leixlip House to all of you. But on the whole, there was something about the place that felt so hauntingly and chillingly serene that I didn't care so much about doing activities. I give this review an 8.

The Bradaun Restaurant:

The commitment to quality evident in the hotel is continued in the restaurant, a bright, high-ceilinged dining room, elegantly appointed with candles and fresh flowers on well-spaced tables.

Head Chef Bryan McCarthy proudly credits his suppliers and devises menus that combine carefully sourced ingredients with imagination, creativity and flair, and food arrives beautifully presented, with wonderful attention to detail.

Specialities include starters of baked Clonakilty black pudding with a compôte of rhubarb and fresh berries, or an unusual dish of Connemara smoked lamb, served with rocket, Desmond cheese, strawberry and aged balsamic.

Slow cooking is a favoured technique and you may find 24 hour braised ox cheek with artichoke purée and broccoli tempura among the choices - the à la carte, especially, is definitely not your average menu.

Seafood choices are equally unusual, and sometimes combined with meat. Choices on the set menu tend to be simpler, and desserts are worth saving a little space for – a millfeuille of Wexford strawberries in season, perhaps, or a cocktail glass of homemade ice cream.

A customer-friendly wine list offers a wide range of wines by the glass, a dozen Wines of the Month and a similar number of half bottles as well as the main listing.
